

## Grayzel Remarks

### Township Committee Meeting

4/18/2012

Thank you to Mr. Mancuso, Mr. Caffrey, Mr. Quinn, Ms. Pardo for all their hard work putting together our budget this year. Thanks also to our department heads who had another tough year to deal with in putting together their departmental budgets.

I would like to commend our various Emergency Services groups who conducted an “open house” of sorts this past Saturday at Emergency Services Day. Various vehicles and equipment were on display for the public to see. My family got a particularly nice tour of the Minutemen’s ambulance and of the “Mrs. B” relief bus.

At last month’s meeting I commented about the effort by several Mayors across the state of NJ for the restoration of funding diverted from Energy Taxes that is supposed to be for local use but has been improperly taken by the State of NJ for use in the State budget. The statutes provide for the distribution of all but a fraction of the energy taxes back to local governments, but the State of NJ is taking well in excess of their share. This has put significant pressure on many municipal budgets over the past years. Restoration of these funds back to Morris Township would lower all of our property taxes. On tonight’s agenda we had a resolution in support of the effort to return the energy taxes back to the municipalities. I think Mayor Mancuso for heading my request and putting the resolution on our agenda tonight. I urge our local residents to speak to our State Legislative representatives – Assemblyman Bucco, Assemblyman Carroll, and Senator Bucco – and urge them to support the restoration of these property tax relief funds for local purposes.
