As you may have heard from a police alert issued there is a Bear with her cubs roaming the woods in the western portion of the Township. Just this morning, the mama bear with 2 cubs on Patriots Path between Whitehead Road & Washington Valley road. Please alert the police if you see any bear get close to any residences.

The Township of Morris' Annual Leaf Collection Program will begin on October 22, 2012. The collection will continue through December 8, 2012. Pick ups are by sector. Find your street -- in [Sector 1](#), [Sector 2](#) or [Sector 3](#). -- in the Municipal Calendar or on our website at www.morristwp.com . This year collection will begin in Sector 3. Leaves, grass clippings and plant waste are to be placed in neat piles at the curb for collection. Please do not place brush, logs or dirt in the leaf piles. Lastly, please do not place piles on pavement or less than ten (10) feet from any storm drain. The storm drains play a very important role in heavy rains and we often have issues with them being clogged during leaf season.
