Morris Township Committee meeting

Morris County has a very nice memorial to the victims of 9/11 that is located on West Hanover Avenue, and every year there is a remembrance ceremony near the anniversary of the tragic 9/11 event. This year the annual ceremony at the county monument will take place on the evening of September 7. It is a beautiful ceremony which is open to the public, and I urge residents to attend.

Development of the Honeywell property is moving forward with a second meeting of the planning board to review the development plan offered up by the developers. The Rockefeller Group will be the lead developer of the overall project and will be developing the office portion of the complex. Hovnanian builders will develop the residential units. If the planning board accepts the general development plan (GDP), then the next step for them would be to submit a formal site plan application to Morris Township's planning board. The hearings will continue with a special session of the Planning Board tomorrow Thursday August 28. Residents interested in hearing for themselves how this large piece of property will be developed should come out to the planning board meeting tomorrow.
